



## Title: Egg hunt

## **Objectives:**

- developing children's imagination;
- enhancing students' knowledge of the nature and animals;
- encouraging children to learn new things through play.

**Materials, equipment:** for two students – a plastic box, potting soil, plastic eggs, for each student – rubber gloves, a small plastic box, a pen and worksheet.

**Stage 1:** It's better to play the game outdoors, however depending on the weather conditions it can also be played inside the school.

**Stage 2:** The teacher prepares the necessary working materials for each student. The tables are arranged for each group of students, as well as the working materials: plastic boxes with potting soil, plastic eggs, rubber gloves, a small plastic box, a pen and worksheets for each student.

**Stage 3:** The teacher explains to the students what they have to do, namely, in each plastic box they will find a plastic egg and will have to guess which animal on the farm belongs to them. After correctly find the name of the animal they will write it on a sheet of paper. The teacher will put on a table several pictures of animals from the farm. Each student will have to take the egg and go next to that animal and tell some information about it, based on the notions already learned.

**Stage 4:** The students look in the box for the plastic egg, write on paper the name of the animal from which it comes, and then go next to the image that represents the animal. Students, who do not write the correct name of the animal, will be guided by the teacher, in

order to figure out what animal it is all about. Students are encouraged to learn new things through play.
