





Title: Internation Day without a car

Objectives:

- Develop skills of nature protection;
- Strengthen physical health;
- Familiarize with some regulations of road traffic and road signs;
- Encourage safe traffic movement with scooters, bicycles, roller skates, etc.

Equipment: various vehicles (scooters, bicycles, roller skates, etc.), road signs.

Stage 1: The community of the institution is invited to join the International day without a car (we ask for adults to use a vehicle that is environmentally safe: public transport, bicycles, scooters, walking, etc.). Implement activities indoors and outdoors.

Stage 2: Indoor (in class) teacher explains the meaning of International day without a car to children. Children learns that on this day it is aimed to draw public attention to the negative impact of transport on the environment and human health. Teacher also explains what negative impact on the environment cars does.

Stage 3: Teacher creates the view of the street in the yard of the institution – they draw pedestrian crossings, road lanes, traffic lights, road signs.

Stage 4: Children arrives with a vehicle of their choise to the educational institution. It must be anvironmentally safe: scooters, bicycles, roller skates, etc. Teacher reminds to children how to be safe on the road, main regulations of road traffic and road signs. Then children takes their vehicles and goes to the street that has been created by the teacher.

Note: Older childer could be taken for a trip to the parks or stadiums that is near by.
